The use of FNSI's data and services can significantly improve planning, decision-making and investment at the community level.

#### FNSI:

- Assists First Nation communities with data collection, research and analysis;
- Collects and aggregates objective, high-quality, non-partisan First Nations statistical data;
- Provides a direct link with First Nation communities for control of and access to their data.

FNSI works to sustain First Nations and their governments' expertise; build statistical capacity within communities; and provide expert advice.

Statistical data provides the basis for effective, evidence-based planning and can serve as a powerful tool for advocacy and building the case for change.

Statistics enable First Nation communities, researchers and policy makers to:

- Negotiate funds, resources and programs with the public sector;
- Structure investment and economic growth strategies with the private sector;
- Effectively design programs and policies; and
- Demonstrate progress and accountability to First Nations citizens.
